PRESIDENT REPORT - CHRIS PICKERING

There seems to be some misconceptions among certain Members of the Branch as to how the Branch is run and how the decision making process works. It is far too easy and convenient for certain individuals to garner support for their cause to put blame on people who have absolutely no input into the policy decisions made and implemented and the one person at the top who they believe has a personal vendetta against them. So, let me clarify to you all how it works. The Branch, as all Branches, operates under the Legion General By-Laws, failure to do so can result in Command stepping in to correct the situation, which may result in the remedy being worse than the illness. When it is pointed out to the Branch that corrections need to be made to bring us back to conformity, the EXECUTIVE AS A WHOLE makes the decisions and approves any changes to the Branch or House Policies to bring the Branch back to where it should be. This also applies to all contracts, policies and decisions made, including financial expenditures. The President cannot make a motion or vote on one, except to break a tie. The President is responsible to Command and to the Members, to ensure the Branch is run in a legal, financial and responsible manner and, while he may have a policy that he would like to implement at the beginning of their tenure, it can only be put in to place with the approval of the Executive. This also applies to the Executive, the positions that hold do not give them the power or authority to hire or fire anybody or set their own policies based on their positions. There have been instances in the past, where Members have run for and been elected to the Executive and have accepted an Executive Chair only to realise that they cannot afford the time to run the positions the way they wanted to and have subsequently quit or failed to turn up for meetings. If you decided to run at the upcoming Elections and are voted in, you owe it to the Members to perform in your position, to the best of your ability, and be a team member who puts what is best for the Branch first, and not try and pursue a personal agenda that only benefits a select few. We, as a whole, need to rid ourselves of the attitude that when something at the Branch doesn't suit us, we direct our anger and misery at the office or others, as this does nothing except show that the complainers have a complete misunderstanding and lack of knowledge of Legion rules and regulations, these things will not change - you have to.

Please come to the Nominations and Elections Meetings and make your vote count.

Good luck to all who decided to be nominated and extra good luck to those elected.

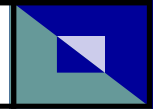

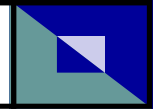

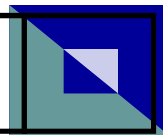

YOUTH EDUCATION REPORT - CAROL GABRIEL

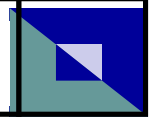

Reminder - Recycle Information - You Can Help

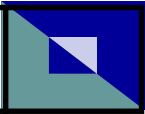

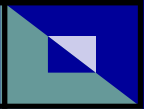
