We have acquired 6 quotes that we will be reviewing over the summer and, depending on the structural engineer's load assessment report, we will be awarding a contract to replace the roof by the fall. Under our charter, we are required to allow the hall to be used for some community events and I believe that we certainly fulfill that agreement, however, I am disappointed by the fact that, even though we provide this service for free, some of the people that use these facilities constantly bring in their own food and drink, everything that is for sale from the bar is cheaper than anywhere else in town, and yes, that profit we get on a bottle of water, does help our bottom line. As the notice says: if you are caught bringing in outside food and drink, you will be asked to leave. Also, it is against the Legion Regulations. This, of course, does not apply to hall rentals or Branch approved events.

Volunteers are always welcome and we especially need you at Poppy time. By helping at this time, you are giving back to the Veterans and Community. It only takes a couple of hours a day for 2 weeks, how hard is that? Also, help is needed Tuesday nights food service.

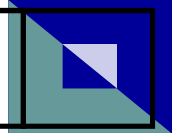

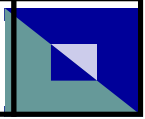
## **YOUTH EDUCATION REPORT - CAROL GABRIEL**

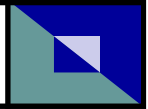
**CHAPLAIN'S REPORT — CANON CHRISTOPHER PRATT**

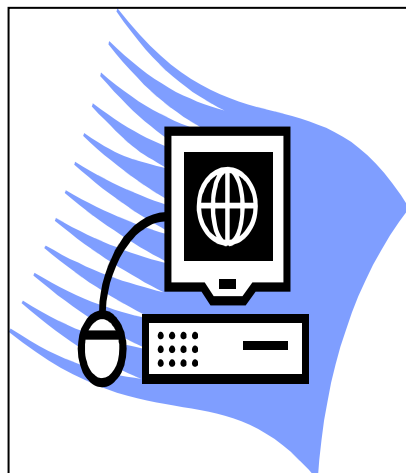

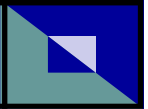
