Welcome Comrades

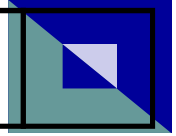

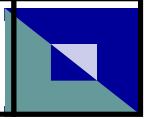
The Public Speaking Contest will be in the new year. I will keep you posted on dates for this when I get the information.

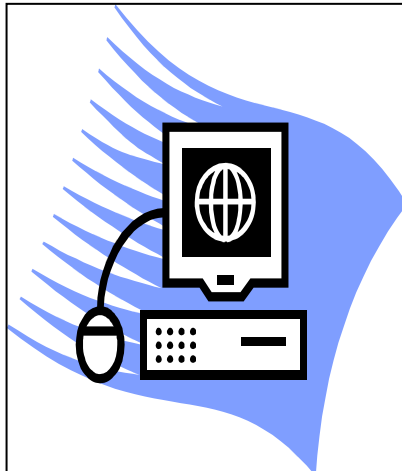

**Lest we forget.....**

Each year, in the coming weeks of November 11th, we see various displays of the red poppy. Whether they're pinned about our hearts, displayed in our windows or saved as our screen savers, they started as a symbol of remembrance for those who lost their lives for our freedom. The poppy is beautiful, bold and elegant. It's bright red flower and jet black centre are a true Canadian symbol of honour. Please wear your poppy in remembrance

**Lest we forget.....**

**100th Year Anniversary Armistice**

On August 8, 1918, Allied forces on the Western Front launched a major offensive against the German lines near the town of Amiens, France.

The Battle of Amiens marked the beginning of Canada's Hundred Days and the last three months of the First World War. During this period of series of impressive Canadian Corps victories on the Western Front solidified their reputation as elite shock troops.

Following the success of Canadian Corps and their Allies in the Battle of Amiens, the Canadians were moved north back to Arras. Having little rest, they continued to pressure the German forces, breaking the Drocourt-Queant Line on September 2, breaching the Hindenburg Line with the capture of Bourlon Wood on September 27, and the pressing on through Cambrai, Mount Houy, Valenciennes and into Mons, Belgium in October and early November 1918.

Canada's Hundred Days culminated with the end of the First World War and the signing of the Armistice on November 11, 1918.
